



2nd Collaborative Workshop on Ethics for a Living Planet Series

Workshop theme:

Exploring the Ethics of

Climate Change, Inequality and Justice

Researchers at Lucy Cavendish College Cambridge, the Department of Land Economy, University of Cambridge, and the Department of Peace Studies and International Development at the University of Bradford formed a collaborative network to explore the ethical issues, challenges and dilemmas for a living planet. This was inspired by the discussions at the Von Hugel Institute Reading Group during the Spring term of 2023 and led by Prof Flavio Comim on Martha Nussbaum's book Justice for Animals. With the encouragement of several Cambridge and Bradford researchers, Dr Sarada Chatterjee (Lucy Cavendish) and Prof PB Anand (University of Bradford) convened the first workshop in June 2023 where representatives of different faiths as well as sciences and civil society (RSPCA) were represented.

With the support of a grant from the School of Social Sciences at the University of Bradford, this second workshop is being organised to continue exploring the ethical challenges and dilemmas related to climate change, climate emergency and climate action. Much has already been written on the ethics of climate change including by many scholars based in Cambridge. Thos of us who have followed closely or participated in the COP28 discussions could see how difficult it is to disentangle fossil fuel dependence from economic development aspirations. As the planet's warming continues unabated and different groups of communities and populations get exposed to climate change induced weather events including flash floods, forest fires, and droughts, there is as yet no sign that the total emissions of greenhouse gases are declining.

Against this backdrop, this multi-disciplinary workshop aims to bring together social scientists, policy analysts and leadership experts to deliberate on and learn from each other.

It is an in-person workshop organised at Lucy Cavendish College (Wood-Legh Room).
